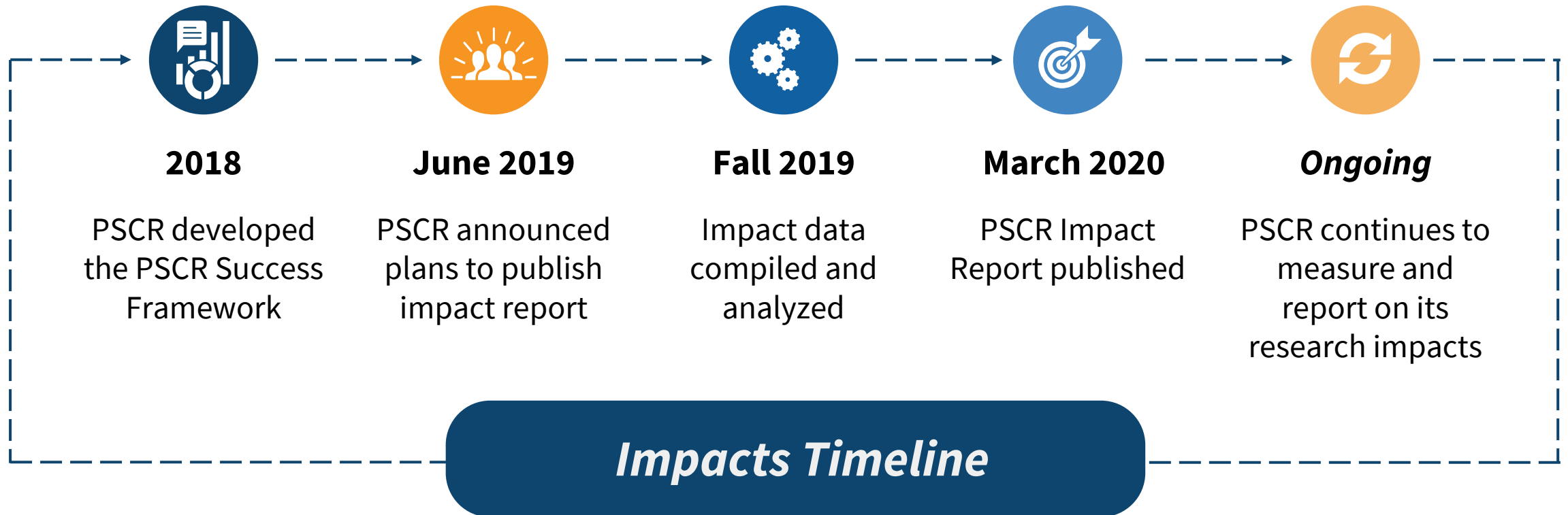

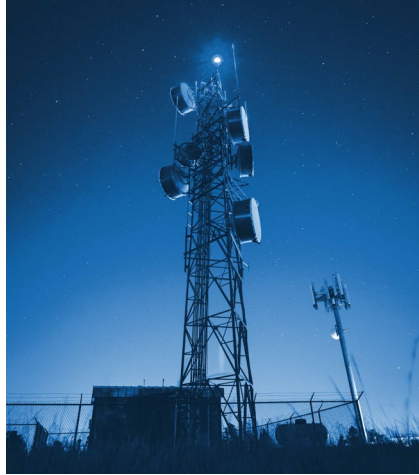

- **20+** Publicly available open source code, VR environments & analytic frameworks
- **1** U.S. Patent Granted, **3** Patent applications submitted for PSCR-funded products



## Open Innovation Program:

- **12** Challenges launched garnering over **350** submissions
- Participants from **20** U.S. States and **7** countries
- **Over \$2.2 Million** in Prizes awarded to-date to **118** winning teams
