**Description:** This SRM is in the form of chips, sized between 0.5 mm and 1.18 mm sieve openings (35 mesh to 16 mesh). The SRM is intended primarily for use in evaluation of chemical and instrumental methods of analysis of steel and materials of similar matrix. A unit of SRM 2166 consists of one bottle containing approximately 150 g of chips.

**Disposal:** SRM 2166 should be disposed of in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations.
