SRM Name: Axial Resolution Standard for Optical Medical Imaging

Description: SRM 2196 is intended primarily for the verification of the calibration of 3D optical medical imaging devices to ensure their uniformity and reliability of test results. The phantom SRM is created to replicate structural characteristics of tissue or material for which the imaging device is used. A unit of SRM 2196 consists of three polydimethylsiloxane (PDMS) layers, where a thin clear layer is sandwiched between two thick scattering layers.

Disposal: SRM 2196 should be disposed of in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations.
