SRM Name: Zinc-Base Die-Casting Alloy F (block form)

Description: This SRM is intended primarily for evaluating chemical and instrumental methods of analysis of zinc-base die-casting alloys. A unit of SRM 630 consists of a bar segment approximately 44 mm square and 19 mm thick. The metallurgical condition is that resulting from a continuous chill casting process.

Disposal: SRM 630 should be disposed of in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations.
